=Policies of the BAIRD Brigade=

BAIRD branches will be published down to one generation past where the **BAIRD** name is lost. That means the children of a **BAIRD** woman will be the last ones printed. I have chosen to publish lineage in this manner so that you, the reader, can open this **BAIRD** publication and read primarily about **BAIRD**s... not Smiths or Taylors.

I may not publish all of the information contributed by a contributor in one issue. We want to have each booklet covering varied **BAIRD** localities and time frames. (If you bought a booklet looking for Ohio BAIRDs to find only Texas BAIRD information, you may be disappointed.)

I will type the information as submitted to me, even if that means that Walter L. BAIRD's birthday is October 25 in one place and October 5 in another. So, proof-read what you mail, please. Also, dates written like 2-7-88, are difficult to interpret (is this February 7, or July 2, -and- is the year 1888 or 1988??) Please write the name of the month (i.e., 2 July 1888 or July 2, 1988) and the whole year i.e., 1888.

I will use upper case when typing of surnames, so if you know that your lady's middle name is her maiden name -or man's middle name, his mother's maiden name,-please let me know by typing the surnames in CAPS or, if you are submitting copies of something already printed, underline the surnames.

I will review books, periodicals, and/or any materials that include the **BAIRD** surname. The review will appear in the issue following receipt. The contributor will receive a copy of The BAIRD Brigade in which his/her publication is first reviewed. When mailing your material for review, include all ordering information i.e., Name & address, purchase price, postage charges, and tax information. I am unable to print a prepared review.

Pictures are welcome and will be printed as illustrations to family data or separately with identifying remarks. Please remember, I can label the pictures only with the data the contributor provides me, so please supply as much information as possible (i.e., names of people, places, dates, any family story connected with the photo, etc.) All persons will be named from left to right unless otherwise noted. There are two ways to submit your photos: **1.** Lend me the original or good copy -- marking it for return to you; or **2.** Have a photo shop prepare, from your picture, a negative or a half-tone print to send to me.

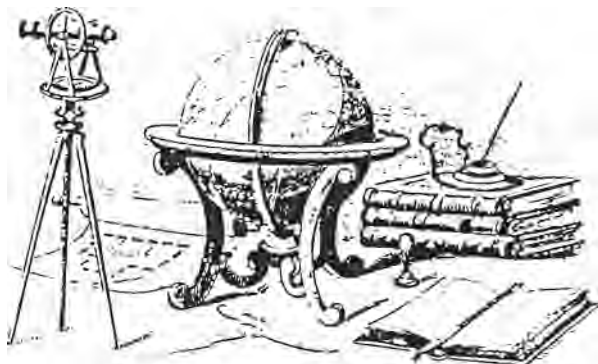

Page 145: Perry twp. What now is Perry twp was first settled in 1805 by John GARWOOD... Herbert BAIRD, ... a Methodist minister from Petersburg, VA. came in 1829. On this farm in 1841 a tragedy occurred, resulting in the death of BALLARD, BAIRD' s son-in-law, who was killed in a quarrel by a man named FORD, the only murder ever being known to be committed in the township. FORD was tried and acquitted on the grounds of self defense.

Page 533: In 1809 Peter WIRICK settled on lot 33, which the nieces of William BATES now own. In 1809 also came Abraham MATHEWS, who settled on lot 6, quarter-township 4, which William A. PARKER now owns. In the same year John BAIRD, with eight sons and six daughters, located on the southeast quarter of section 24, on the Salt Fork. In 1818 Thomas F. BAIRD settled on section 3, and was elected Justice of the Peace in 1830. His second wife now owns the farm... ..The first regular election held for township officers was that of April 7, 1817, when ...Thomas BAIRD, Jacob LANNING were elected Constables. July 19, 1817, the trustees levied a tax of \$20.90, which was appropriated to the use of the public roads in the twp.

Page 541: "Physicians"... Dr. Absalom BAIRD was of Scotch ancestry. His father, John BAIRD was born in Scotland about the year 1730, and came to America with General BRADDOCK in 1755, and was with that general at the defeat on the

Monongahela. After the defeat he retired with the troops into winter quarters in Philadelphia, where, in the winter of 1756-57, he married a Quaker Lady. In 1758 he was in one of the Highland regiments sent out under FORBES to attack Fort Du Quesne, and was said to have been killed in the battle of Grant's Hill, Pittsburgh, September, 1758. He left a widow with the infant son, Absalom, who was born in Chester Co., PA., in 1758. His mother was left with small means, and to support and educate her son taught school for several years. After imparting to him all the instruction she was able he was sent to school at Pequa, Lancaster Co., then under the charge of Robert SMITH.

After leaving school he studied medicine under Dr. Gardiner SCOTT of Chester Co. He had just left his studies at the outbreak of the Revolution. Dr. SCOTT raised a company of volunteers, and BAIRD enlisted and was made ensign. Soon he was appointed assistant surgeon in a Pennsylvania regiment. He was present at the storming of Stony Point, NY, by the forces of General WAYNE on the night of July 15, 1779, When WAYNE was wounded in the head by a musket-ball and the wound dressed by Dr. BAIRD.

On the 20th March, 1790, he was commissioned surgeon in Col. Jedutha BALDWIN's regiment, where he remained until the regiment was disbanded by act of Congress, March 29, 1781, when his military services in the Revolution terminated. In 1781 he entered upon the duties of his profession in Kennett Square, Chester County. On the 14th of July, 1783, he married Susanna BROWN, and July 26, 1784, their first child, John BAIRD was born. In November, 1786, he moved his family to Washington, PA., and commenced the practice of this profession. In July, 1788, he purchased of John HOGE, lots 12, 13, 14, on the north side of Maiden Street, between Main and Franklin. On these lots he built a residence, in which he lived until his death. The homestead afterward was in possession of Thomas H. and George BAIRD, and in 1832 was owned by William BAIRD. They are now owned by Mrs. C. H. SCOTT.

Dr. BAIRD was commissioned Justice of the peace and of the Court of Common Pleas on the 3rd of March, 1789, and remained in office till the justices of the courts were abolished in 1791.

Page 19: BAIRD, This is another name to which, like that of CAMPBELL, is attached the legend of killing a wild boar. The King whose life was said to have been saved was William the Lion; before the first surviving charter of the 13th century, to Richard BAIRD of Meikle and Little Kyp in Lanarkshire. Early in the following century King Robert BRUCE bestowed the barony of Cambusnethan on Robert BAIRD, and from there the family spread first to Baniffshire, and then to Auchmeddan in Aberdeenshire. Here George BAIRD married a member of the great KEITH Family, hereditary Earls Marischal, and a succession of BAIRD sheriffs of Aberdeenshire testify to the prestige which this alliance brought them.

From Auchmeddan sprouted the branch of Newbyth which gave birth to John BAIRD. Before his death in 1698 he had become a judge of the post-revolution regime, with the courtesy title of Lord Newbyth, and a baronet. This baronetcy passed to William BAIRD, whose second son, David, became one of the leading generals of the wars. But the world renown of this name was bestowed on it by John Logie BAIRD (1888-1946), whose ancestry is uncertain. He was born at Helensburgh on Dunsbartonshire, son of the Rev. John BAIRD, and educated at Glasgow University, In 1926 he gave the world's first demonstration of television in an attic. In 1928 took place the first trans-Atlantic

transmission. From first to last, BAIRD was the pioneer of every development associated with television, and few men have done more to alter the habits of the human race throughout the world.

Page 104: Thomas H. BAIRD, jurist; b. Washington, PA., Nov. 15, 1787; son of Absalom BAIRD. Studied law with Joseph PENTECOST. Admitted to the bar in 1808; pres. judge 14th district of PA., 1818 - 1837, impeached by PA. Legislature for removing a majority of the attys. from roll in Fayette County, 1835, acquitted; moved to Pittsburgh, 1837, admitted to Pittsburgh bar, 1838. Died Nov. 22, 1866; buried in Washington, PA.

Born: March 4, 1760 in New Jersey

Service: Quartermaster: New Jersey, He enlisted in Monmouth County in the First New Jersey Militia, September 1776. He re-enlisted, serving for different periods each year until the close of the war, serving under Capt. COONS; Capt. Samuel CARHART; and Capt. Cornelius SCHANCH. Col. Asher HOLMES; Col. Thomas HENDERSON; and Col. Cahart WALTON. He served as Private, Sergeant, Ensign Lieutenant, and Quartermaster.

Marker: His name is inscribed on granite tablet set in floor of drinking fountain in front of Post Office, Danville. The marker was placed by Governor BRADFORD Chapter DAR in 1915.

Page 13: BEARD, James

Born: Pennsylvania

Buried: Heathville, Crawford Co., Illinois, near the Lawrence Co. line

Married: Never married

Residences: From Pennsylvania, moved to Kentucky, and in 1810 came to Lawrence Co. Service: Soldier; Pennsylvania. Served from Cumberland Co., PA., in the 2nd Company, 4th Battalion, under Col. Samuel CULBERTSON in 1782, and the same year with Capt. John McCONNELL. Soon after the close of the war of 1812, he was plowing in a field when an Indian who had a fancied grievance against him, stole up behind him and shot him, killing him instantly.

Marker: His name is on a bronze tablet at the Lawrenceville Court House, placed by Toussaint Du Bois Chapter DAR in 1921.

The number following the Head of Family indicates the county he resided in at the time of the census. When determining an individual's county residency, take the number following the individual's name and refer it to the county page numbers listed below.

For example, if you wish to determine the county residency for the first individual listed, Absalom BAIRD, you would refer number 246 to the list below and find that this number falls on the second page listed for Washington County; therefore, Mr. BAIRD was a resident of Washington County.

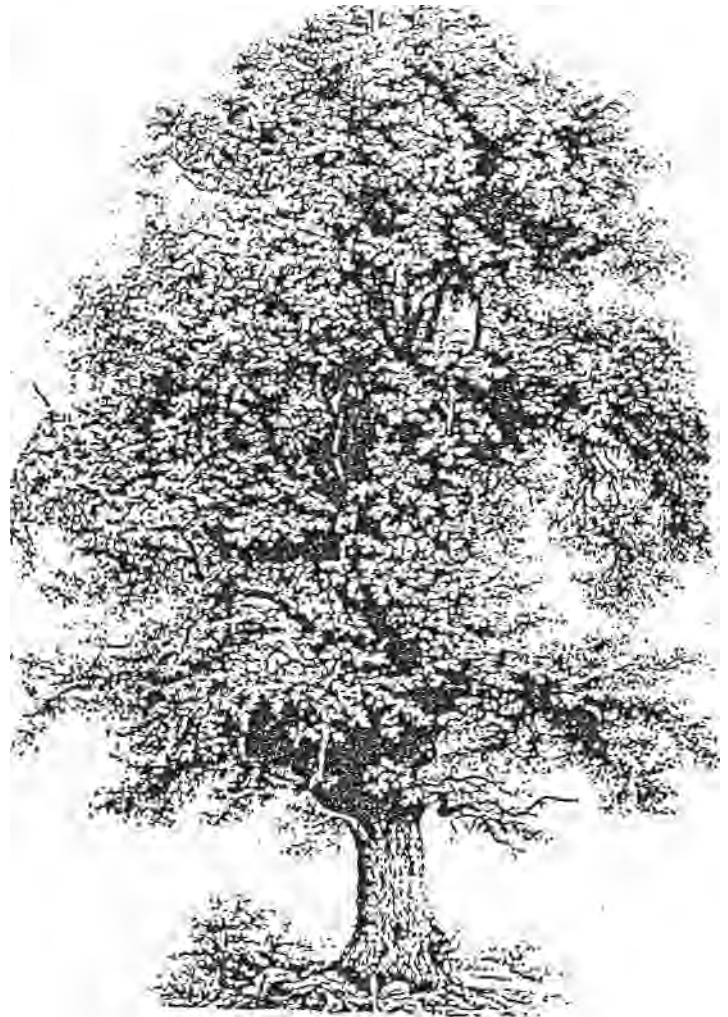

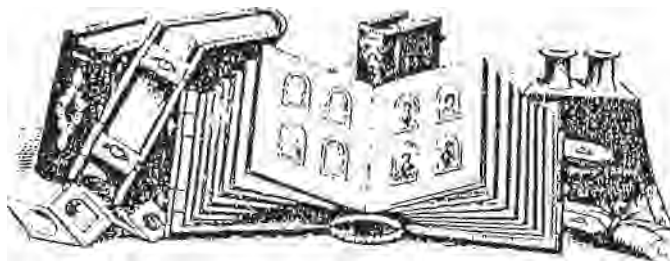

==A BAIRD FAMILY LEGEND==

Some facts concerning the BAIRD - DOWNING line:
a true Indian story: quoted from a letter by Mrs. Ella MILLS of Ennis, Texas. copied
Dec. 14, 1933 by Idelphia A. PEACOCK REGHI.

Sarah, or Sallie LEE, was stolen by the Indians when she was a very young girl. A raid was made by the Indians on the LEE and WALKER Families after peace had been declared between the whites and Indians in connection with the War of 1812.

It occurred on a rainy day. Mr. LEE and Mr. WALKER had met to Cast Up their accounts. Their homes were not far apart. The savages broke in upon them. A struggle ensued and both the men were tomahawked. The women and children, except two young women who were spinning upstairs and who hid in a closet and thus escaped, were taken prisoners. There were also two young men, a LEE and a WALKER boy, who were away from home at the time who also escaped.

These two boys vowed vengeance, when they returned home and found what the Indians had done. The two young women left were frightened so terrible that they were afraid to venture from the house. The bodies of the two fathers lay on the ground and on the breast of one lay his baby boy, less than a year old, asleep. The Indians had taken it and dashed its head against a tree and left it for dead. It had revived and crept to its father's arms. This child lived to be eleven or twelve years old but its brain had been injured and it never had much sense. Some time after this an Indian came asking his way to a certain part. The WALKER and LEE sons suspecting he had part in the horrible wrecking of their homes, took him to a secluded spot and killed him.

The savages with their little group of prisoners marched on. One of the women, the LEE woman, was bitten by a rattlesnake. She bore up as bravely as she could but when she could no longer bare to walk, she sat down on a log. The Indians killed her and scalped her. The others were going on ahead but they heard the Indian warhoop and one of the little girls looked back. It was the one whose mother had been bitten by the snake. As she looked back over her shoulder she saw the Indians waving her mothers' scalp.

On arriving at the Indian camp, the girl, Sallie LEE, was given to an old squaw to look after. She said that night as she lay on the animal skins she saw scalps hanging up and her mothers' among the rest. She cried as though her heart would break, and the old squaw seeing the cause of her extreme grief got up and removed it - the one with the long black hair.

Sallie's sister, Rebecca, was also among the captives. After a very long time these girls were bought back. Sallie was bought first. The man who made the purchase went in a canoe. He said they had to slip Sallie from the old squaw who had grown very fond of her. The other captives told that she was "shut up so that she would not know it". After Sallie was bargained for, the white man took her in his canoe.

Another little girl captive followed along the bank begging him to take her also. He was afraid to do this fearing the Indians, but the girl followed a long way and when he was far enough away he thought the Indians could not catch up, he did take the other girl in the canoe and paddled for dear life till they were safe.

* * * * *

When Sallie LEE grew to womanhood, she married John BAIRD. There were three children; James, Elizabeth or Betsy as she was called and Sarah or Sallie. After the death of his wife, Sallie, John BAIRD remarried. Jane BALLARD became his wife. They had four children; Indiana, Fanny, Rebecca Jane, and John BAIRD, Jr. John BAIRD Senior died at the age of 57 years of cancer of the nose.

James BAIRD married twice. His first wife was a BURHAM. His second wife's first name was Theresa or Thursa. There were two children. editors' note: (names unknown)

Elizabeth or Betsy BAIRD married Dr. Samuel DOWNING, in 1829. There were several children, among them James L., Jason Jackson, Samuel Walker, Thomas Hurst Caroline, and Catherine Elizabeth DOWNING.

Sarah, the third BAIRD married John ARTHUR.

Indiana and Rebecca BAIRD married Robert Jackson DOWNING and Jason DOWNING (brothers) respectively. Mrs. Ella MILLS is the daughter of Indiana BALLARD BAIRD and Robert Jackson DOWNING. John BAIRD, Junior married Sarah WOODBURY.

John BAIRD, who married Sallie LEE, was of Irish decent. His mother, Martha BAIRD, was said to have spoken a distinct Irish brogue. The family were noted to be industrious, warm-hearted and true.

Descendants of brothers, Merle Verne BAIRD, Sr. and Harry Isaiah BAIRD held their family reunion at The YMCA Camp of The Rockies in Estes Park, Colorado, August 14 through August 16, 1992. Merle (born 6 September 1883 Madison County, Iowa and died 22 February, 1956 Los Angeles, CA.) and Harry (born 15 November 1888 Bayard, Iowa and died 18 July 1954 Galen, Montana) were the sons of Isaiah G. (born 1854 Guernsey County, Ohio; died 1911 Greenfield, Iowa) and Margaret JACK BAIRD. Isaiah was the son of Joseph M. (born 1810 Jefferson township, Ohio and died 1897 DeWitt, Iowa) and Mary GILLESPIE BAIRD; Joseph's parents, who had 14 children, were John, (b. 1760 in Fayette Co., PA, died 1843) and Susannah FRAME BAIRD. John's father was Moses BAIRD (b. 1736, died 1754) who married Margaret BROWN. Legend says that Moses probably came to America from Ireland through New Jersey, and moved on to Bucks County, PA where he settled and served in the Pennsylvania Militia during the Revolutionary War.

Our festivities began on Friday evening. There was a short "get acquainted" program, to learn about the earlier generations of our family as traced back to Moses BAIRD.
