Page87: James Francis BEAIRD Family

James Francis BEAIRD was the son of William Benjamin BEAIRD and Hannah Lavinia RAYBURN, both natives of Union Parish, James Francis BEAIRD was born in Webster Parish on October 6, 1868 and married Eula Catherine GREEN (born January 25, 1875) on July 24, 1895 in Webster Parish. To this union was born the following children: Lilla Mae, July 6, 1897; Nelia Doyle, September 12, 1898; Mary LeTricia, December 17, 1899; James Luther, November 10, 1901 and Annie Lee, February 10, 1904. (Annie Lee died October 22, 1904).

James F. BEAIRD came to Coushatta (1902-1903) leaving his family for a while in Webster Parish. Mr. BEAIRD built, owned and operated the first manufacturing business in Red River Parish known as the Coushatta Bottle Works. The business was located near the Green Warehouse belonging to the Stephens Company on Ringgold Avenue, south of the Louisiana Arkansas railway. Mr. BEAIRD bought the property from J. J. YEARWOOD who previously had purchased it from Catherine OWENS, a black land owner in the parish.

On June 9, 1904, Mr. BEAIRD's wife, (who had been ill for sometime) died.

In the summer of 1904, Mr. BEAIRD left the two youngest children with relatives in Webster Parish and brought Lilla (7), Nelia (6), LeTricia (5) "Tishie" to Coushatta where he had built a home next to the Bottling Works. Catherine OWENS helped care for the children.

The children ate their meals at a boarding house operated by Sheriff Ben ELLIOTT's wife, Susie, just south of the BEAIRD's home in the old Staton house on Ringgold Avenue.

The Coushatta Bottling Works became operational in the spring of 1904, James BEAIRD made his own syrup and mixed it with the necessary carbonation. Several flavors were available, including lemon, orange, strawberry and cream soda. Perhaps the way the drink bottles were capped accounted for the name "soda pop". The stopper or cap was made inside the bottle and attached to a sturdy wire with ridges resembling a hair pin. The pin protruded from the top of the bottle, and after the bottle was filled, a foot pedal operated a contraption which pulled the pin up; this had the effect of tightly closing the bottle. To open, the pin was pressed down by a light blow with the palm of the hand thus giving a "pop" sound.

The bottles which contained the pop were made at the Bottle Factory in Shreveport, Louisiana. They were heavy with a characteristic light blue color into which the markings of Coushatta bottle Works, Coushatta, Louisiana was made into the glass. Approximately 400 of the bottles were dug from the yard of the Marion BOSLEY house where they had been used (upside down at an angle) to border a walkway and two flower beds. The location of the old Bosley place is now the home of Lucille CORLEY HUCKABAY at 830 East Carroll Street.

Three people who were employed by Mr. BEAIRD in the Bottling Works at some point in time were Hargrove THORNTON, Rufus LOVETT and L. 5. HUCKABAY, Sr.

It is not known exactly when Mr. BEAIRD sold

the Bottling Works, but he was operating the business and living beside it when he was married the second time on June 8, 1906 in Red River Parish to Susan Idahilia BREEDLOVE (born February 9, 1880). To this union was born James Francis, Jr. on September 3, 1914 and a daughter, Neoma on November 3, 1919.

Around 1907-1908 Mr. BEAIRD bought a spot from a Mr. HUNTER on East Carroll Street near the present Coushatta High School and built another home, having sold the one beside the Bottling Works to Mr. Will CAGLE. Mr. BEAIRD sold the East Carroll home to B. L. BROWN in 1919 for \$1,500.00 reserving the right to occupy it until January 1, 1920.

In 1920 the BEAIRD family moved to Cedar Grove, Louisiana. Here Mr. BEAIRD worked as a carpenter for a few years before buying a farm in Doyline, Louisiana. He remained in Doyline until the early 1940's when the United States Government bought the land to enlarge the Munitions Plant during World War II.

After a few years in Cotton Valley, Louisiana, James BEAIRD and his second wife returned to Red River Parish. Mr. BEAIRD bought a farm north of Coushatta on Highway 71 from Mrs. Touilletta SMITH on August 20, 1945. He died January 24, 1946 and is buried in Pleasant Valley Cemetery in Webster Parish where his first wife and daughter are buried.

James BEAIRD's wife continued to live in Red River Parish for a while but finally sold the farm and made her home near her daughter, Neoma BEAIRD WELLS, in San Antonio, Texas until her death, November 23, 1972. She is buried in Marble Falls, Texas.

The only living descendents of James F. BEAIRD residing in Red River Parish are a daughter, Nelia Doyle who married Claude H.

TOWNSEND on March 5, 1918 and one grandson, Louis Claude TOWNSEND, born December 13, 1918.

Son and Abbie lived and worked in Coushatta. They had two children: Sharon Ann, b. 21 Mar. 1948, and James Michael, b. 05 Aug. 1949. Sharon m. 1st James Earl FELTS and 2nd Joseph Henry RUF III, b. 13 Mar. 1942, in Philadelphia, Pa., son of Joseph Henry, Jr. and Anna ZIMMERMAN RUF. Mike married 17 Feb. 1973 in Danbury, N.C., to Brenda Mae OVERBY, b. 12 Sep. 1947, daughter of William Thomas Calvin and Ida Mae GORDON OVERBY. Mike and Brenda have two sons, James Calvin, b. 25 Oct. 1977, in England and Bryan Michael, b. 25 Apr. 1979, in Hampton, Va. Mike is a member of the United States Armed Forces.

Son was stricken with polio during a severe epidemic when Mike was young, which led to his death.

After Son's death, on 20 Dec. 1973, Abbie married Alvin WILSON of Harmon, La. He is the fifth child of Robert and Lyde WILSON. Alvin has a son from a previous marriage, Roger Alvin WILSON, of Many, La. They own and operate Wilson Well Service of Many. Roger is married to the former Mignon SHELTON, and they have two daughters, Victoria & Terry Lee. Victoria is married to Jeffery SEESE. They have one son and live in Parksburg, W. Va. Terry is married to Mark BRYANT. They live in Many and have one daughter, Elizabeth Lee.

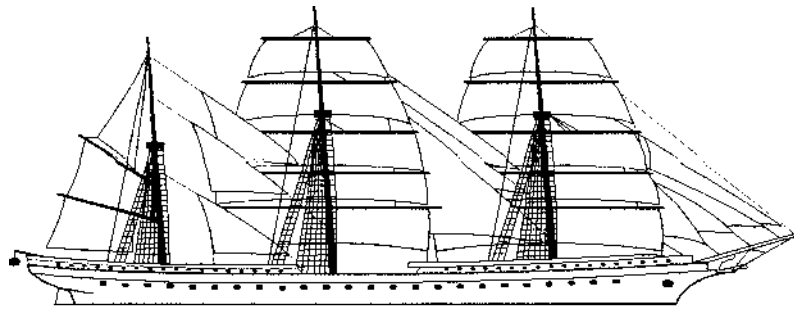

+PASSENGERS TO AMERICAN (CON'T):

NOTE: Certain words that recur frequently in the "Remarks" column have a special meaning as used in the above index. "Immigrated, " means the individual furnished his own transportation to Maryland, while "transported" means that someone other than the person indexed paid for his passage. Quite often a person "transported" is also described as a "servant, " which means that he had contracted to repay the cost of his transportation by agreeing to act as a servant for a period of years. Under certain of the Conditions of Plantation, a servant was entitled to claim fifty acres of land upon completing his period of servitude satisfactorily. Such claims are indicated by the word "service."

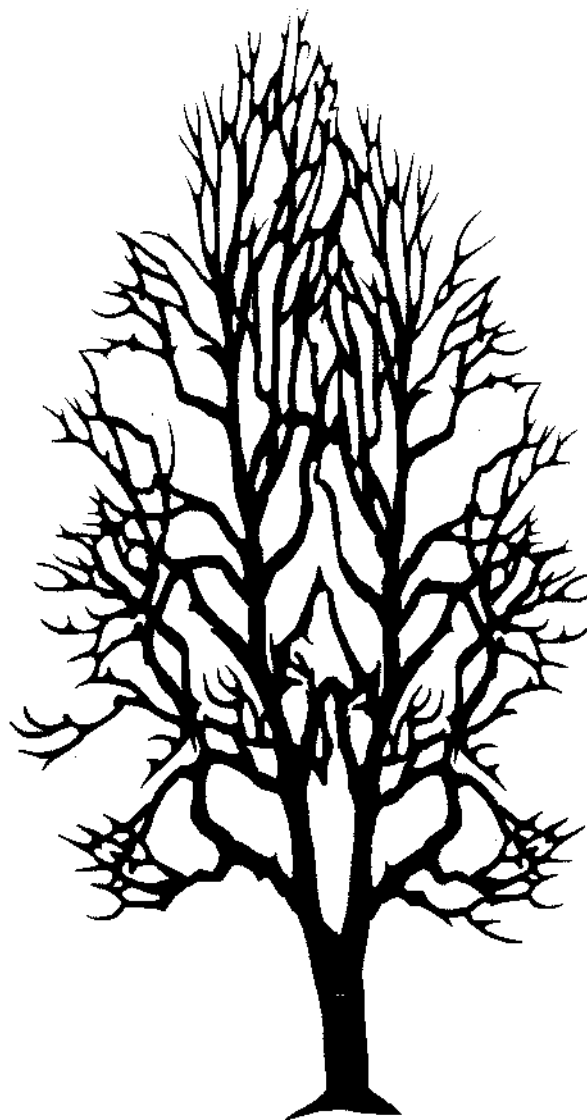

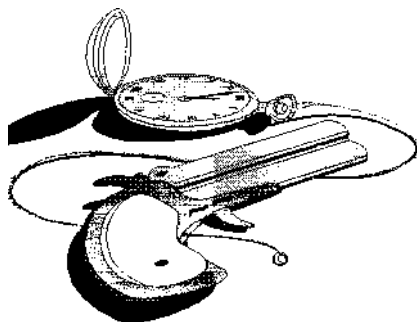

Eva Jane BAIRD WELLS was the third daughter and sixth of eight children born to Simon BAIRD and Susan Elizabeth GOODRICH BAIRD. Eva was born on a farm outside Bluff City, Kansas the 13th of September 1888. She moved to Wisconsin with her family in her late teens and to Wilbur, Oregon when her father retired. The BAIRDS bought a house on the same block as the WELLS family, newly arrived from a ranch in Magdalena, New Mexico. Eva and Harvey WELLS were married in the Wilbur Methodist Church the 10th of February 1914. In 1916 they moved to Colorado and homesteaded property southwest of Los Animas. 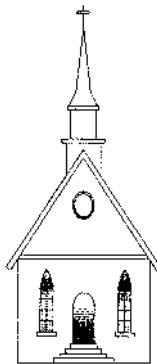

JAMES BAIRD, EARLY SANTA FEE TRADER, by Frank B. Golley, Graduate of Purdue, Washington State and Michigan State Universities, now teaching zoology at the University of Georgia, a descendant of James Baird, Santa Fe Trader. April, 1959.

The Legend of James BAIRD from Vol. # 11 continues:

THE IMPRISONMENT OF THE BAIRD PARTY

The length of time BAIRD and his companions languished in the *ca/abozo* attached to the governor's palace in Santa Fe is unknown. No record of the prisoners has been found before November, 1814, when a city council report locates them in Chihuahua, Mexico. Sometime between their arrest and this date they were marched south past the village of Albuquerque, across the Jordan del Muerto, to El Paso del Norte on the Rio Grande, and finally to Chihuahua. Word of their imprisonment did not reach St. Louis until early in 1813.

Meanwhile at home, in the spring of 1813, BAIRD's father-in-law, Thomas WILSON, fearing an Indian uprising in the War of 1812, sent a keel boat to transport his daughter and her family back to Pittsburgh. All but the eldest son, James, returned. During this period, or possibly before the family left St. Louis, BAIRD's property was sold to pay the debts of the expedition. John MULLANPHY held power of attorney for BAIRD, and bought the blacksmith shop and lot; later he deeded this property to the Sisters of Charity, who built a hospital on the lot. Of other property the record is silent.

After returning to Pittsburgh, Jane BAIRD traveled to Washington to enlist help for gaining her husband's release. As a result of her efforts in Washington, or through the efforts of John McKNIGHT, their case was laid before the Department of State by Edward HEMPSTEAD, delegate to Congress from Missouri Territory. Apparently none of these efforts was of any avail, for the federal government made no attempt to gain the release of the prisoners at that time.

James BAIRD and the other prisoners, meanwhile, were at liberty in the City of Chihuahua, although under bond. Sometime between November 15, 1814, and November 11, 1815, the captives were tried for their part in the supposed conspiracy of 1812, and were confined in the Military Hospital in Chihuahua. The signatures of BAIRD, McKNIGHT, McDONOGH, PATTEN (probably BAUM), and COOK on the court order indicate that a portion of the party had been informed of their sentence. From later letters and reports, CHAMBERS, SHREVE, MINES, AND ALLEN were also known to be in Mexico. CUADO is the only one not accounted for. J. W. BAIRD states, that BAUM was shot in Santa Fe when the Americans were first captured. BAUM was certainly not shot, since he appears in later records, but the Spanish interpreter, CUADO, may well have been executed as a traitor by Governor MANRIQUE. This is not an unlikely assumption, when we consider the fate of some of the members of the Texas-Santa Fe Expedition of thirty years later.

In Chihuahua the Americans were confined in the Military Prison or the Old Cathedral Prison. Probably these were one and the same place, since KENDALL and GREGG both describe the Jesuit Hospital used as a prison, to which was attached a large, but uncompleted, church. This church might have been confused by the Americans as a cathedral. While confined, the prisoners were maintained from the proceeds of the sale of their goods, at a rate of 18-3/4 cents per day.

In contrast to the majority of the party which remained in Chihuahua, BAIRD was sold as a captive to Don FRANCISCO VELUSO, who put him to work in the silver mines of Durango. BAIRD attempted to escape from this unpleasant situation but was recaptured and confined to a dungeon for nine months. The following excerpt from the ADAMS letter indicates the severity of his treatment by the authorities:

The drawn work was done about the year 1817 while in a Mexican prison. He was one of the first Americans who got into the mines of Mexico and was rewarded by seven years imprisonment for his temerity. After an attempt to escape he was placed in a dungeon for nine months during which time his hair turned snow white. When released from this darkness, being allowed no books, instruments, or writing materials, grieving over his fate and that of his wife and children, he found in some soup sent him by the wife of the governor of the prison, a small and very sharp bone, from which he made a needle which he used to do some work on his clothing. The same kind woman sent him a linen pillow case worked like the sample as all Mexican linen is worked to this day. He raveled the work out and begged her to send him a piece of linen and some thread, which she did, and he did this work happy to find something to keep him from losing his mind. He only did a few stitches a day lest it should be too soon finished.

A piece of the needle work made by BAIRD while he was in prison and brought back by him when he was pardoned is now in the possession of Miss Maybel le BAIRD of Philadelphia, aunt of the present author. It is an elaborate drawn-work pattern done on coarse linen. BAIRD eventually gained his release from prison by repairing a gun for an incoming governor of the Province of Durango, and a workbox for the wife of VELUSO. During this period he also mended a silver communion service. A silver fork and spoon, which he made while he was a prisoner at the silver mines and brought back to St. Louis with the sample of his lace, have not been located.

While BAIRD and the other prisoners were suffering hardships in Spanish jails, the government of the United States made little effort to gain their release. It has been suggested that the United States government was not able to procure the release of the prisoners between 1813 and 1817 because Don Luis de ONIS, who alone had the influence to gain this end, was not recognized as the Spanish ambassador, while the minister of Joseph BONAPARTE had no power to do anything in Mexico. In any event, after Delegate HEMPSTEAD's attempt in 1813, no further interest in the case was evidenced until February 8, 1817, when James MONROE, Secretary of State, addressed a letter about the prisoners to ONIS, who was by then recognized as ambassador ..

Since no definite success had been gained in obtaining the release of the prisoners, a resolution was passed by the House of Representatives on April 10, 11818, asking the President, James

MONROE, for information about the American citizens imprisoned in Mexico. The above documents were communicated by the Secretary of State on April 15, 1818, to the House in respect to this resolution. No particular measure was adopted by the House in behalf of the prisoners, and, in November of the same year, Delegate SCOTT again applied to the Secretary of State about the progress of negotiations for release of the prisoners. SCOTT received from the Secretary a copy of a letter from Viceroy Apodaca to ONIS, in which the viceroy stated that he had directed an immediate inquiry to be made into the prisoner's case, "and that the most favorable decision would be made which was compatible with the laws and orders of his sovereign." After this flurry of interest in the captives, nothing further was done to gain their release by the Federal government. This lack of proper concern for American citizens, although due partly to weakened Spanish power in Mexico, and the fact that more important negotiations were underway between the Spanish and American governments, was heavily criticized by the press and probably was the cause for Robert McKNIGHT's saying on his return to the United States after his release from prison: "I will go back to Mexico, swear allegiance to their government, and become a citizen. I have resided the prescribed term of years, and there is better chance of obtaining justice from the Mexicans, scoundrels as they are, than from my own government. I will recover as a citizen of Mexico what I lost as a citizen of the United States. My own government refuses to do me justice, and I will renounce it forever. I would not raise a straw in its defense."

During the next few years events moved rapidly in Mexico. Revolutionary conditions forced Ferdinand VII, King of Spain, to give a general order for the prisoners' release in May, 1820. A notice in the Pittsburgh Statesman, April 28, 1821, from the S. Louis Enquirer, July 12, 1820, titled "American Captives at Liberty," described the liberation of the American prisoners:

We learn from Major BIDDLE, of the United States Army, who arrived here from the Arkansas, that while at Fort Smith, there arrived at that Post, William MEEKS, a sergeant, who accompanied the expedition of the late General (then Lieutenant) PIKE, after a detention by the Spanish government for 14 years—the sergeant was captured in March, 1807, and carried to Chihuahua, at which place he was released in September last in consequence of a general order from the King of Spain, directing the release of all Americans, and in obedience to which the following prisoners together with the sergeant, were permitted to leave the country:—Peter BAUM, Samuel CHAMBERS, Benjamin SHREVE, John STEPHENSON, William GREY, Charles MINT, Robert McKNIGHT, James BAIRD, Simon **McCOY**, and **C. KING**. the last two were captured at the time NOLAN was killed and have been detained in the country 20 years; but the principal part of them composed an expedition which left St. Louis several years ago, upon a trading adventure into the Spanish territories, where they were captured.

The following is a postscript to a letter received from Mr. James BAIRD (one of the prisoners) by his son in this place: "P. S.—the friends of those who do not return in this party (those who arrived in Arkansas) may wish to know where they are. William MINES is clerk in a store in Mexico and has promises of being well provided for by his employers. McKNIGHT is in Guarisame, about 200 miles west of this city, where there are several rich mines—he is in a store and has part of the profits. ALLEN was in the same place, with a small store, but a few days ago I heard that

he had gone on towards the coast of California. I have not heard from him or McKNIGHT since the news came that we were set at liberty, although I wrote them immediately. Thomas COOK died in consequence of his imprisonment and Michael McDONOGH has become a monk, in the convent of Guadalupe in Sacatecas [Zacatecas]." Dated at Durango, Sept. 12, 1820.

The party of prisoners left Mexico and arrived in St. Louis in the early months of 1821, possibly by way of the Canadian River. James BAIRD may have been with his compatriots, but one source states that he remained some months in Mexico to examine the possibilities for trade, and when he was ready to return to St. Louis was unable to find a partner to accompany him, so made the trip across the prairies along.

On their return the captives spoke of their adventures and the possibilities of trade with Mexico. These stories induced at least two American traders, Col. Hugh GLENN and Thomas JAMES, to take expeditions to Santa Fe that same year. On May 10, 1821, Thomas JAMES and John McKNIGHT (brother of Robert) left St. Louis with about ten men for Santa Fe. This expedition had two purposes: one, to take advantage of the trade possibilities described by the returned prisoners, and, two, to rescue Robert McKNIGHT, who, it was feared, had not been released with the others.

The venture was not entirely successful, but in December Thomas JAMES advanced John McKNIGHT \$200.00 from the proceeds of their sales to go to Durango to find his brother. In May, 1822, John and Robert returned to Santa Fe. The following June the JAMES-McKNIGHT party left Taos for St. Louis, which they reached in mid-July. Contrary to some writers, James BAIRD was not in this party or in Col. GLENN's party, which returned from Santa Fe at about the same time. BAIRD is not mentioned in either the JAMES or the Jacob FOWLER notes.

The final chapter of the Legend of James BAIRD will be printed in the next issue of The BAIRD Brigade.

Social Security Administration: The Social Security Administration (SSA) started keeping SSN records in November 1936. No records on individuals who died before then. You may request a Microprint of form SS-5 (Card Application) as follows:

Cost for Microprint of form SS-5 with provided SSN: \$7.00

Cost of Microprint of form SS-5 without the SSN: \$16.50

It is helpful to provide with your request; the date of birth, date of death and state the SSN was issued, if known.

You may make payments by sending a check or money order, payable to the Social Security Administration, sent to; Social Security Administration, Office of Central Records Operation, 300 N. Greene Street, Baltimore, MD 21201.

How To Locate Anyone who is or has been in the Military: OBTAINING MILITARY RECORDS - Records of Current, Retired and Former Members of the Military. Current and former members of the military (or next of kn, if deceased) can obtain copies of their complete military personnel and medical records.

Due to the Freedom of Information Act, anyone (civilian or military) may receive limited information from the military personnel records of current, former or deceased member of the military.

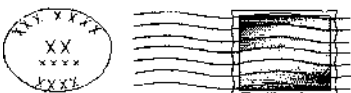

NATIONAL ARCHIVES: The National Archives has custody of millions of records relating to persons who have had dealings with the federal government. These records are deposited in National Archives facilities in the Washington, DC, area and in the eleven National Archives Regional Archives. Types of records:

Population Censuses: The National Archives has the 1790-1870 schedules, a microfilm copy of the 1880 schedules, the surviving fragments of the 1890 schedules, and a microfilm copy of the 1900 and 1910 schedules.

Mortality Schedules: Whenever possible, the National Archives acquires microfilm copies of the mortality schedules of the 1850-80 censuses from the various depositories where they are held.

Land Records: Dated chiefly 1800-1974 include bounty-land-warrant files.

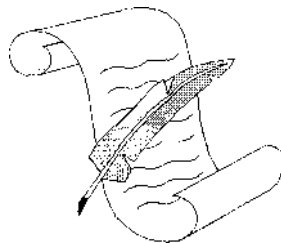

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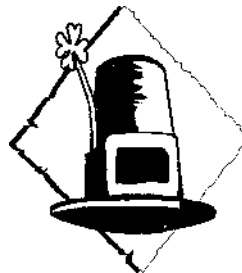
